

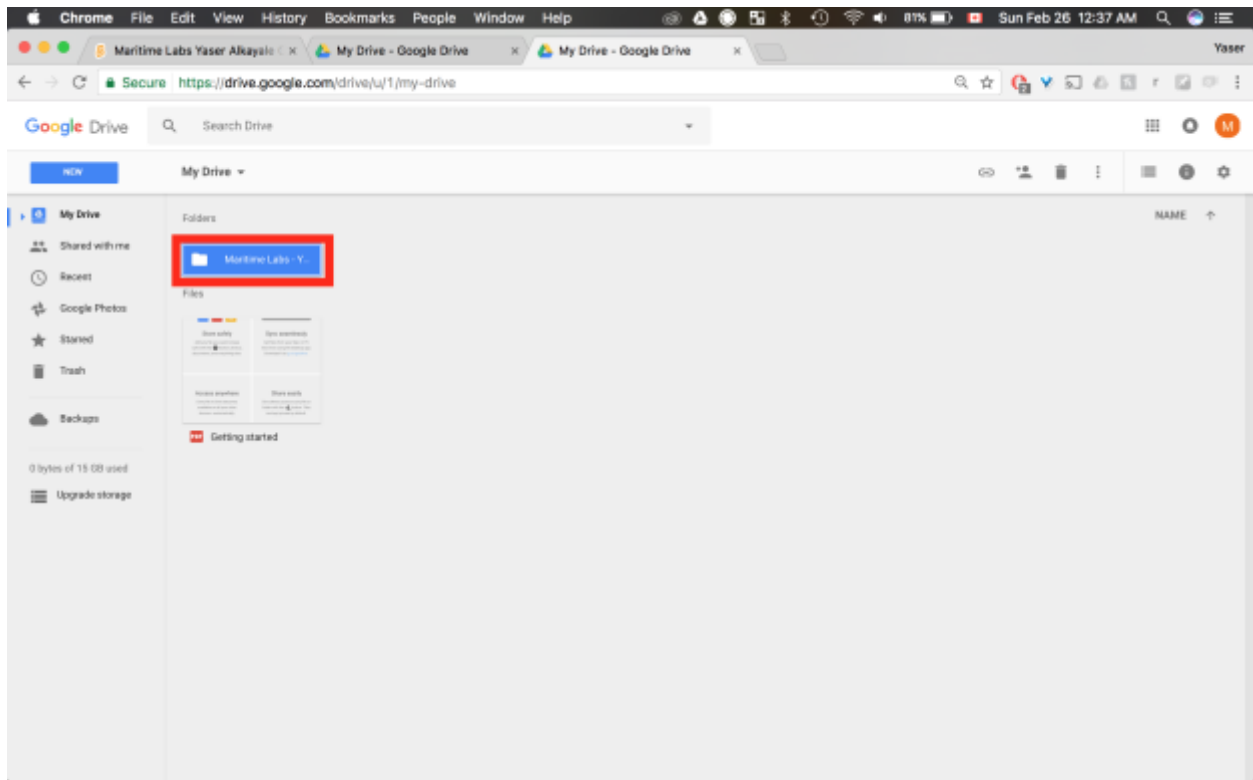

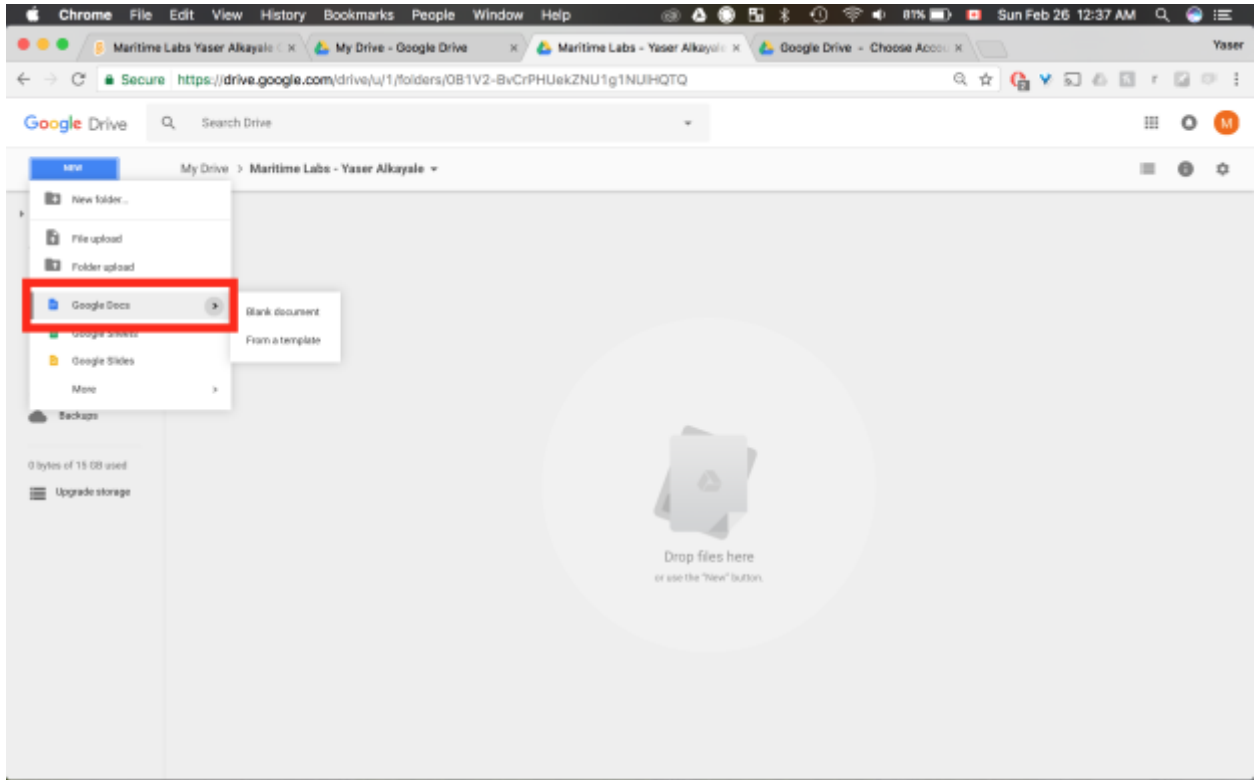

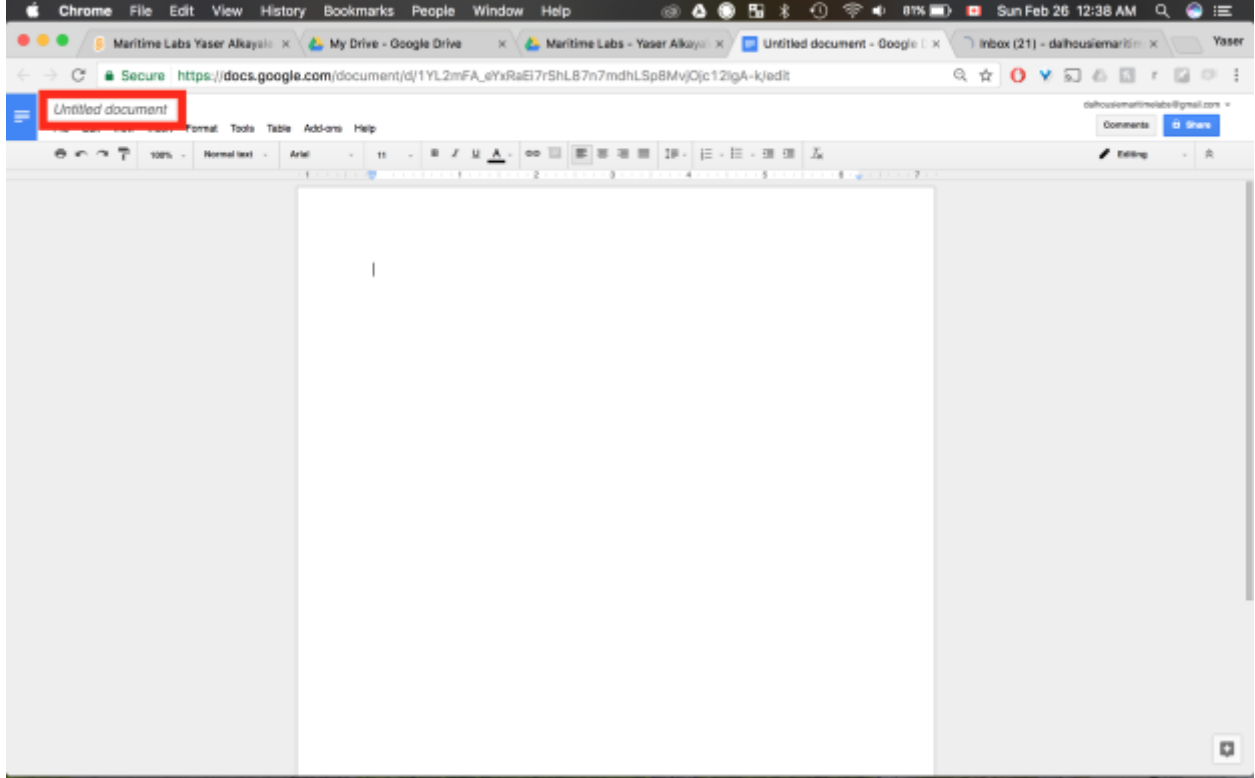

5. Answer the following question on the page (minimum 100 words)

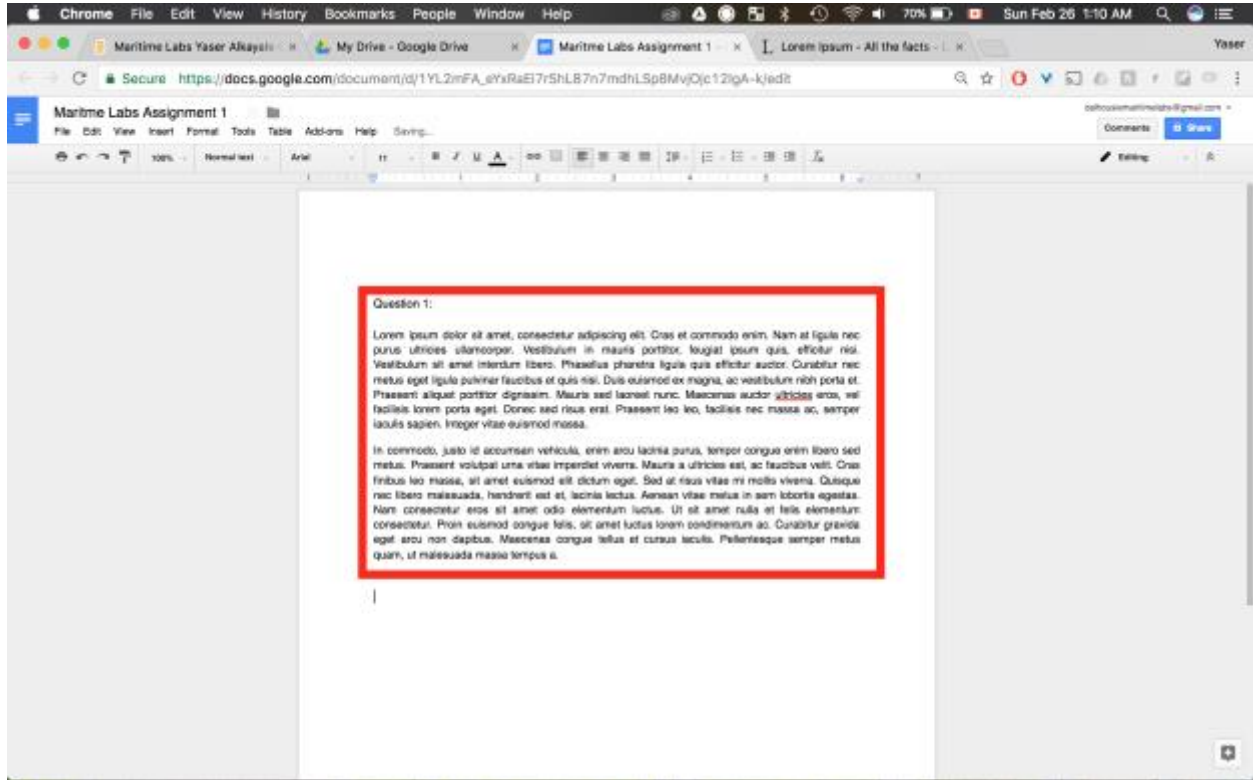
Question 1:

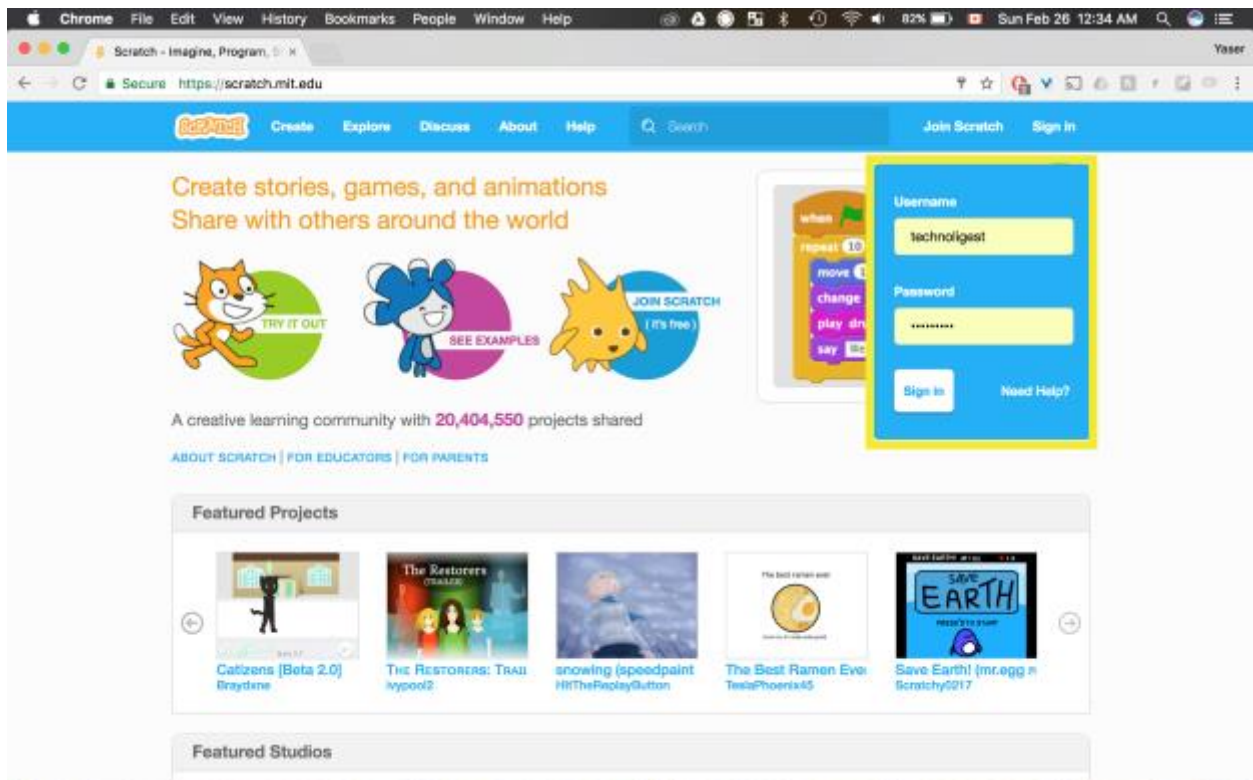
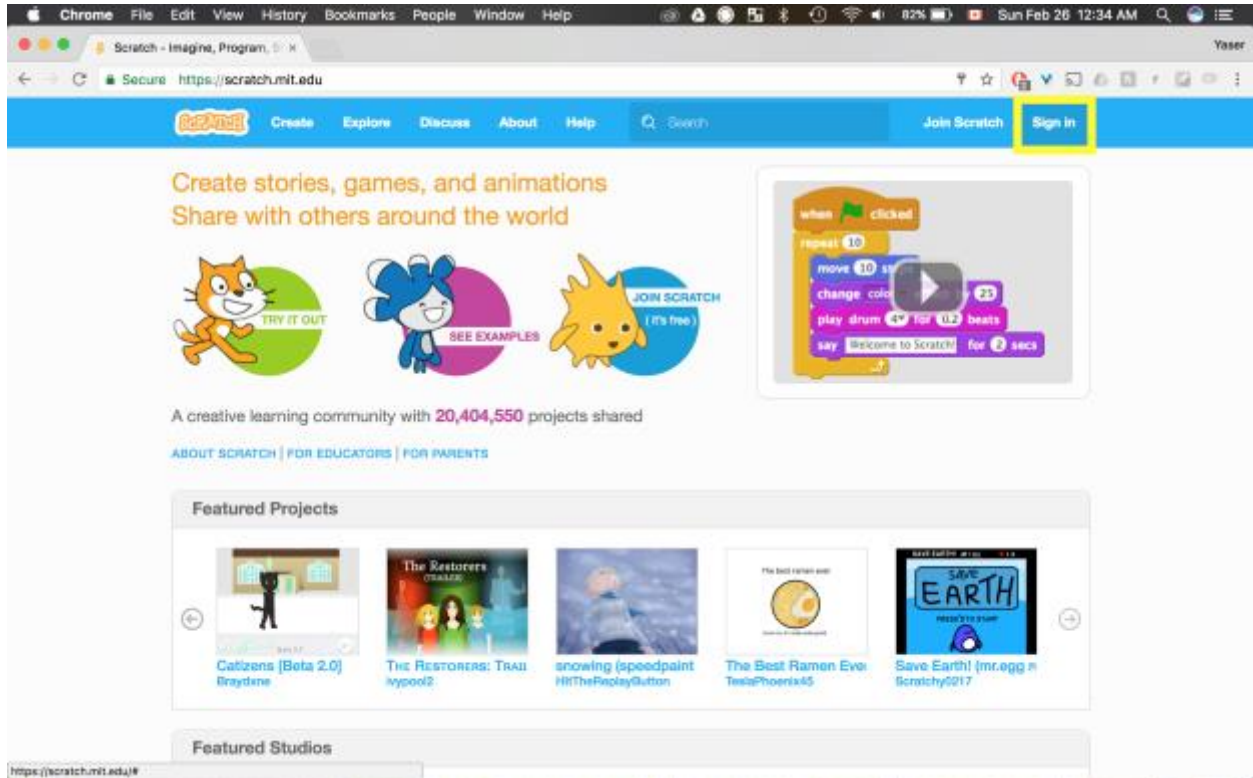
- When was it?

- Was language a problem? How? What did you do?

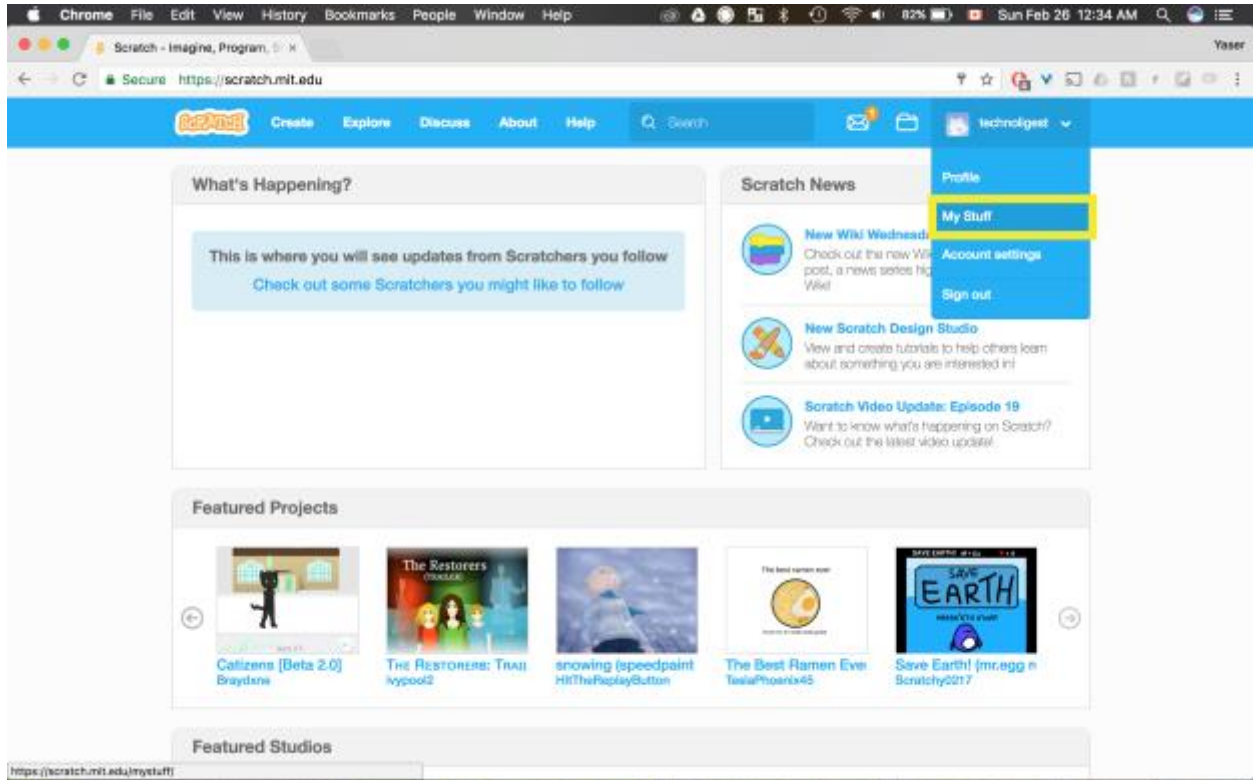
